BAITING FOR RATS:

Place the Ratinator on the ground in infested area, preferably with the trap door placed along a wall or running space. Place your bait inside the traps bait box located in the middle of the trap. It is best to place a small sampling of the bait being used in the front of the trap door and a bit along the sides as well.


HOT TIP:

For the initial placement you may want to tie the trap door so it stays open. Place your bait in the trap and allow the rats to go in and out freely for a day or two until they become comfortable with the trap. After a day or two when you see that the bait is being eaten, untie the door and bait heavily that evening.

PREFERRED RAT BAITS:

- Grains (parrot mix, chicken mash/scratch, sunflower seeds)
- Tuna (an open can of tuna placed in the bait tunnel works wonders)
- Dog/ Cat food







HOW DO I CATCH A SKUNK?

Skunks are nocturnal so you will typically only catch them after sunset and before sunrise. Locate the area that you have noticed the most skunk activity in and place your baited Skunkinator trap before dusk.

HOW DO I BAIT THE SKUNKINATOR?


Simply open the sliding front release door and place your bait into the bait box. Close the front door and that's it! No tricky triggers to set. Your Skunkinator is set and ready to go.

PREFERRED SKUNK BAITS:

When trapping skunks remember this; skunks are stinky and they like stinky stuff. They have a great sense of smell and love smelly/oily food.

- Sardines
- · Canned cat food/Canned tuna
- Bacon
- Dry dog food/Dry cat food
- Chicken (cooked or raw)
- · Peanut butter

BAITING FOR CHIPMUNKS:


Baiting the Chip-munk-inator is really easy. Once you have decided on where to place your Chip-munk-inator, set the trap on the ground, throw a handful of bait in the middle of the trap, sprinkle some around the outside of the trap (be sure the doors are open) and walk away. That's it!

*Do not put the bait on ANYTHING! No paper plates, no bowls, just toss it on the ground in the middle of the trap and broadcast a small amount around the trap.

PREFERRED CHIPMUNK BAITS:

- Grains (parrot mix, livestock sweet mix, chicken scratch, sunflower seeds)
- Cereals
- Dog/ Cat Food
- Bird Seed
- Parrot Mix





Open both doors and attach spring to keep them open while catching chipmunks. Close and latch doors for transport.




BAITING FOR SQUIRRELS:

Baiting the Squirrelinator is really east. Once you have decided on where to place your Squirrelinator, set the trap on the ground, throw a hand full of your bait in the middle of the trap, sprinkle some around the outside of the trap (be sure the side doors are open) and walk away. That's it!

- Do not put the bait on ANYTHING! No paper plates, no bowls, just toss it on the ground in the middle of the trap and broadcast a small amount around the trap.
- Do not put the trap over the Squirrel's hole or directly next to it. Squirrels will forage up to 50 feet away from their holes.

PREFERRED SQUIRREL BAITS:

- Grains (parrot mix, livestock sweet mix, chicken scratch, sunflower seeds)
- Cereals
- · Dog/Cat food
- Fruits/Veggies (tomato, avocado, mangoes...)







Open both doors and attach spring to keep them open while catching squirrels. Close and latch doors for transport.

^{*}The Squirrelinator and The Squirrelinator without Basin are the exact same trap. The only difference is that one comes with a basin.
