May also be planted along walls or foundations, and makes for a good plant for massing on slopes to prevent soil erosion.

About This Variety: Athyrium filix-femina, better known as Lady Fern, is deciduous, and native to the more temperate regions of North America, Europe and Asia. The erect fronds grow in a circular clump like form. Its natural habitat is rich moist woods, fields, meadows and ravines and all sort of shaded gardens.

Growing Instructions: Part shade to full shade is preferred. Regular watering and a layer of mulch are beneficial.

Care Tip: Equally happy in average or moist soil; Ferns will grow in sun with constant moisture. Not fussy, it adapts well to less than ideal conditions. Cut back fronds as they die out in hot summers.

Exposure: Partial shade to full shade

Height: Grows 12-36" tall

Spacing: Plant 18" apart, 0.5" deep

Hardy in: USDA zones 3-9
