## Van Zyverden's ALLIUM MAGIC



Allium are in the same family as garlic, onions, chives and shallots. This makes gardeners wonder if they should include them in their ornamental gardening plans, as it conjures up images of supermarket produce. But because good garden designs are often made up of different shapes, allium's rounded blooms make for high drama and interest in the garden. The Allium group gets more popular annually, from over 300 species to choose. They amaze everyone, and few plants create this kind of wow in the garden. We will be adding many new varieties shortly.

Very easy to grow

Deer and rodent resistant

Undemanding summer flowers, adding height and structure to the garden About This Variety: Allium Magic is a striking and unique species, hence it's Magic name. It produces a single stem, which supports a very large 8-10" flower globe. Also sometimes called Persian Flowering Onion.

Growing Instructions: As Alliums do not like wet feet, find a sunny location where the soil drains well or try to improve the drainage. The bulbs will rot in wet areas. Aside from that, almost no maintenance is required.

Care Tip: Dig, divide, and replant bulbs after a few years of decreasing flower production.

Exposure: Full sun to partial shade

Height: Grows 36-40" tall

Spacing: Plant 12" apart, 5" deep

USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 5-8
