About This Variety: Hosta Rainforest Sunrise is a herbaceous perennial which was named Hosta of the Year in 2013. While the leaves start out light green they mature quickly in leaves with green borders and a golden center. When sunlight hits the leaves it really brings out the fluorescent golden accent. leaves are slug resistant and handles a lot of sun.

Growing Instructions: While drought tolerant, they do not like being kept dry for long, and prefer rich, well-drained soil with a consistent supply of moisture.

Care Tip: Virtually maintenance free, clip out dead flower stalks after flowering.

Exposure: partial shade to full shade Height: grows 8" tall Spacing: plant 16" apart, 1.5-2" deep USDA Zones: hardy in USDA zones 3-9
