About This Variety: Hosta Twilight produces larger and wider leaves then Fortunei Aureamarginata of which it is a sport. While the center of the leaf is a dark green, the wide golden margins is what makes this variety stand out. The leaves are heavy in substance. It is said to be slug resistant and sun tolerant.

Growing Instructions: While drought tolerant, they do not like being kept dry for long, and prefer rich, welldrained soil with a consistent supply of moisture.

Care Tip: Virtually maintenance free, clip out dead flower stalks after flowering.

Exposure: partial shade to full shade Height: grows 20-21" tall Spacing: plant 35-39" apart, 1.5-2" deep USDA Zones: hardy in USDA zones 3-9
