
Van Zyverden's DAFFODIL TAHITI





Daffodils (botanically called Narcissus) are long term perennials and make for great companions to not only other bulbs, but also annuals, perennials and all sorts of shrubs. They soften hardscapes, accent most any garden and are an inexpensive solution to adding color to your garden on nearly any budget. They are relatively pest free and deer will not eat them. Daffodil classifications become quite technical, as they are divided into 13 divisions according to their flower shape and heritage by the American Daffodil Society. They do well throughout most of the U.S. as long as there is a discernible winter. Daffodils are ideal for large plantings and naturalizing, making them an exceptional value item and providing years of carefree color.

1956 Lionel Richardson award-winning variety About This Variety: Tahiti is a double type of Daffodil that produces large flowers 4 1/2" across in size. It blooms yellow with red-orange segments in the center of the flower atop narrow, strap-shaped green leaves which grows in clumps.

Growing Instructions: In fall, plant the bulbs deep in fertile soil with the pointy end up in an area with full sun to partial shade. These bulbs do not like wet feet. Water during their growth period. Fertilization helps growth and natural increase by offsets. Daffodils can be left undisturbed to naturalize for years. If you cannot plant them immediately, store in a cool, airy place.


Care Tip: When given ample sunlight, water, proper nutrition, they will return for years to come with little other efforts. Remove the flowers after they bloom and allow the leaves to brown before removing.

Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Height: Grows 12-16" tall

Spacing: Plant 8" apart, 6" deep

USDA Zones: hardy in USDA zones 3-8
