Van Zyverden's ECHINACEA FATAL ATTRACTION



Echinacea, also known as cone flowers, are drought tolerant, deer resistant and attract pollinators. Bold, fragrant, daisy-like blooms grow on tall stems. Echinacea is a favorite of the herbal medicine industry and is always one of the most profound wild flowers on the plains. Plant en masse to create curb appeal and help support threatened wildlife. Native to the southeastern United States

About This Variety: Fatal Attraction typically grows in an upright clump and produces dark green leaves on almost black stems. Its fragrant, purple blooms will withstand the elements. Widely sought after variety.

Growing Instructions: Best planted in full sun and will return for years to come. Divide clumps when they become overcrowded (about every 4 years). Plants usually rebloom without deadheading, however, prompt removal of spent flowers improves general appearance. Freely self-seeds if at least some of the seed heads are left in place.

Care Tip: Best in groups or massed, but is also an excellent specimen and/or accent plant.


Blooms: June to September
