Van Zyverden's HEUCHERA FIREFLY



Heuchera, which is also commonly known as Coral Bells, are native to the north American Continent and like Caladiums are more often grown for its leaves then its flowers. They can be planted in containers, borders, beds, and woodlands. This evergreen perennial comes in traditional green-leaved varieties and in the bold newer variegations in between.

About This Variety: Firefly, also known as Leuchtkafer, is a perennial that produces ivy-like leaves and red flowers on top of slender stems.

Growing Instructions: Coral bells like a neutral to slightly acidic soil pH, somewhere between 6.0 and 7.0. Good drainage is a must, especially in shaded areas. Sitting in the damp soil will cause the crown to rot.

Care Tip: Cut back the entire flower stalk after blooming to put the plant's energy into growing more leaves.


