Monarda, also known as Bee Balm, has fascinating scented masses of large flowers. It is a vigorous clump-forming herbaceous perennial sure to return for years to come if planted zone appropriate. Thrives just about anywhere. The blossoms are difficult to describe but very decorative. The leaves are mint scented and are edible. Known to attract scores of butterflies and humminobirds. Great for a wet qarden!

Care Tip: Deadhead spent flowers to encourage new blooms. Should be cut to the ground after flowering to promote new growth.


Blooms: July to August
