

With its deer and critter resistant attributes, daffodils are ideal for large plantings and naturalizing to provide years of easy spring color.

About This Variety: Daffodil Golden Ducat is a stand out in the garden. It produces large, golden yellow, 4-5" double blooms, atop tall grey-green leaves. Perfect garden accent or focal point and creates wonderful curb appeal.

Growing Instructions: In fall, plant the bulbs deep in fertile soil with the pointy end up in an area with full sun to partial shade. These bulbs do not like wet feet. Water during their growth period. Fertilization helps growth and natural increase by offsets. Daffodils can be left undisturbed to naturalize for years. If you cannot plant them immediately, store in a cool, airy place,

Care Tip: When given ample sun light, water, and proper nutrition, removing the flowers as soon as they fade and allowing the leaves to brown before removing, they will return for years to come with little to no effort.

Exposure: Full sun to partial shade Height: Grows 14-16" tall Spacing: Plant 8" apart, 6" deep USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 3-9
