

Step 1. Before connecting your existing garden hose to the containers, run the water briefly to ensure that no debris has gotten into your garden hose from the prior season.

Step 2. Establish your container layout FIRST before adding potting mix or water. It's important to make sure all containers are on level ground.

Step 3. Connect your FarmDaddy 12 inch rubber hose to each of the containers before adding potting mix. This will make the setup easier.

Step 4. Place the black end cap provided on the end (last) container.

Step 5. Fill up the containers half way with potting mix, be sure to break up any large clumps, and then soak with water thoroughly until saturated.

Step 6. Fill up the containers the rest of the way to the very top or even a little over with Potting Mix, then repeat the soaking process.

Step 7. Make a trough (groove) in the potting mix approximately three inches in depth going the length of the box and then add three cups of organic fertilizer to the trough and cover up with potting mix.

Step 8. Add your weed cover over the container and cut holes where the seeds or starter plants will be planted. The weed cover will help keep moisture contained inside and help eliminate disease and pests.

Step 9. Plant your seeds or starter plants and use the planting guide provided.

Step 10. Water each seed or starter plant thoroughly. This is the only time you will self water. Connect your garden hose, turn on the water, and *"Grow Like a Pro!"*
