


References to "right" and "left" in this manual are based on the operator standing at the rear of the spreader, looking toward the front of the spreader.

SPREADING INSTITUCTION.

1. Shut of tractor and set parking brake.

2. Move APRON-CHAIN LEVER and BEATER LEVER to "ON" position.

3. Start tractor and begin moving forward.

4. Operate spreader at 3-5 mph.

5. De not operate spreader over 5 mph.

6. De not back up spreader when it is in unloading mode, to avoid damage.


7. When done unloading, shut off tractor and set barring brake.

Operator Qualifications and Sign Off Sheet

Operation of this machine shall be limited to competent and experienced persons. In addition, anyone who will operate or work around this machine must use good common sense. In order to be qualified, he must also know and meet all other requirements, such as:

- 5. It is the responsibility of the owner, qualified operator/s or supervisor/s to see that no unqualified persons are allowed to operate this machine and that unqualified persons (especially children) stay out of the work area.



ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Remove tongue (1) assembly from shipping skid.
- 2. Fasten tongue (1) to axle (3) and to spreader box (2) using provided 5/16" fasteners(A) and 3/8" fasteners(B).




- 3. Unbolt lag screws which secure shipping skid to spreader.
- 4. Use overhead hoist to lower spreader to ground. NOTE: Spreader weighs 385 lbs.

SAFETY & ACCIDENT PREVENTION

A CAUTION

T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc. has taken the operator's safety into consideration when designing this spreader, by covering exposed moving parts for protection. However, in order to assure proper operation, some areas cannot be guarded or shielded. The safety alert symbol below indicates a hazard.

Do not operate, service, inspect nor otherwise handle this unit without reading the Owner's and Operator's Manual completely and being familiar with the operation of this machine. - 1. Do not load rocks, metal nor other items, that could become dangerous flying objects during unloading.
- 2. Be sure spreader has been cleared of tools and is safely distanced from people before operating.
- 3. Never start the machine until all safety shields are secured in place.
- 4. If shields or decals become damaged or lost, contact dealer or factory for free replacement.
- 5. Do not wear loose nor floppy clothing, which may become entangled in spreader.
- 6. Do not step nor ride on spreader while it is moving.
- 7. Never get off tractor while it and/or spreader is moving.
- 8. Operate spreader at 3-5 mph. Use slow-moving-vehicle sign when required.
- 9. Avoid steep inclines, large rocks, stumps & holes.




EXPOSED APRON CHAIN & ROTATING BEATER

Keep hands, feet, hair & clothing away from apron chain & rotating beater.

- Do not unplug, adjust, clean, service nor repair machine while it is moving. Apron chain or beater could accidentally become engaged.
- Disengage apron chain & beater, block wheels, and disconnect from power source, before adjusting or servicing.
- Do not step, climb, stand nor ride on machine while it is moving.
- Point discharge away from people, animals and buildings, before engaging.

MOVING PARTS CAN PINCH, CRUSH OR DISMEMBER Do not operate without all shields in place.

- Keep hands, feet, hair and clothing away from moving parts.

- Disengage beater & apron chain, block wheels, and disconnect from power source, before adjusting or servicing.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

HOOK-UP INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Tractor must be 10 HP minimum, with a hitch approx. 10" above the ground.
- 2. Shut off tractor and set parking brake, before attaching onto spreader.
- 3. Move APRON-CHAIN LEVER and BEATER LEVER to "OFF" position.
- 4. Attach manure spreader hitch to tractor hitch, using a 5/8" hitch pin that will not bounce out.

FILL-UP INSTRUCTIONS

- Make sure APRON-CHAIN LEVER and BEATER LEVER are in "OFF" position.
- 2. Make sure no chunks of manure are frozen to spreader floor.
- 3. Make sure apron chain is not frozen to spreader floor.
- 4. Load spreader from front toward back for easier unloading.
- 5. Do not fill spreader above side panels.
- 6. Do not pack manure against beaters.
- 7. Do not load string nor wire. They can wind onto beater while unloading.

SPREADING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Shut off tractor and set parking brake.
- 2. Move APRON-CHAIN LEVER and BEATER LEVER to "ON" position.
- 3. Start tractor and begin moving forward.
- 4. Operate spreader at 3-5 mph.
- 5. Do not operate spreader over 5 mph.
- 6. Do not back up spreader when it is in unloading mode, to avoid damage.
- 7. When done unloading, shut off tractor and set parking brake.
- 8. Move APRON-CHAIN LEVER and BEATER LEVER to "OFF" position.
- 9. Clean manure from cracks and corners, to increase life of spreader.

Spread *into* the wind, especially when strewing heavy, mucky loads. Clods of soggy manure sometimes cling to beaters . . . and can spray back toward driver.

<u>"</u>3-5 mph" (needed to obtain desired spreading action) = a **comfortable** walking pace

-"over 5 mph" (can cause premature wear or damage) = a **very-brisk** walking pace

SERVICE AND MAINTENANCE



Disengage apron chain & beater, block wheels, and disconnect from power source, before adjusting or servicing.

Always replace guards before operating manure spreader. If guards or decals become damaged or lost, contact dealer or factory for free replacements. Failure to heed these instructions could result in severe personal injury or death.

GENERAL MAINTENANCE

- Check the spreader each time it is used for loose, bent, broken or missing parts. During operation, listen for abnormal sounds which might indicate loose parts or other damage. Correct any problems immediately.
- Rinse manure out of the spreader after each use to prevent rust and avoid winter freezedown.

LUBRICATING INSTRUCTIONS

As with any type of equipment, the life of the unit is dependent upon the lubrication care given by the operator. Lubrication should be done at regular intervals to avoid premature failure.


Bearing, Sprocket & Chain Lubrication:

Grease bearings and sprockets after every 6-hours of use and just before storage (with a multi-purpose grade of grease).

Grease lube fittings until grease begins to seep from fittings.

Replace fittings when they will not take grease (all lube fittings are SAE standard).


Six locations require greasing (marked by "6 hr." grease decals).



Lubricate apron chain and roller chain with chain lube or motor oil once a month. Lubrication will reduce friction, quiet spreader and greatly extend chain life.

Apron-Chain Tension:

- 1) Pull up on the floor apron-chain flight at center of the spreader box length.
- 2) If you can lift the bottom of flight higher than 2", the chain is too loose (which can cause premature chain and sprocket wear).
- 3) If you can not lift the bottom of flight at least 2", the chain is too tight (causing excessive loads on all components).
- 4) To adjust the apron-chain tension, use the 3/8 x 6" tension bolts on each side of the front apron shaft.
- 5) Check that chains on each side of apron are <u>equally</u> taut.



Cam Arm Pulley:

Check alignment of cam arm pulley with cam. Cam should align with center of pulley.

Fasteners:

Tighten all fasteners after approximately 10-hours of use. This should include all bolts, nuts and set screws. Periodically tighten all fasteners to prevent elongation of holes and premature component failure.

Latch Adjustment:


Symptom: Apron chain is not moving

Problem: Improper latch adjustment

Solution: Adjust latch as follows.

1) Raise left drive wheel off the ground

- 2) Remove crank-arm guard
- 3) Turn left drive wheel by hand, while checking latch (5) engagement into the sprocket tooth (6)
- 4) Loosen-lightly the four 5/16" lock nuts (4) which attach latch bracket (3) onto spreader-box side
 - 5) With roller (2) positioned on highest point of ratchet cam (1), tap the latch bracket (3) ahead or back as necessary to attain 3/32" to 1/8" of clearance between the latch (5) and the sprocket tooth (6). See illustration below.
 - 6) Re-tighten the four 5/16" lock nuts (4) that attach latch bracket (3) onto spreader-box side
 - 7) Re-install crank-arm guard



Cold Weather Instructions

- Manure can be spread in cold weather, although snow and ice may affect the spreader wheel traction required for good spreading action (because the cleated spreader wheels drive the apron chain and the beater).
- While manure should not be stored in the spreader, it must not be stored in the spreader during freezing weather. Frozen manure could result in severe equipment damage, such as breaking the floor apron chain.
- Store spreader under cover in freezing weather. Exposure to snow and ice can cause the mechanisms to freeze and not operate properly, and they may break under the stress.

Limited Warranty

T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc. warrants this unit to be free from breakage or malfunctions due to defects in material and/or work-manship under normal farm use and service, for a period of **one-year** from date of original sale. Should such breakage occur within warranty period, the liability of T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc., its employees, agents, authorized distributors, and dealers (hereinafter collectively referred to as sellers) is hereby expressly limited to repairing or, at its option, replacing free of charge at its factory, any part or parts found upon examination by factory to be defective in material or workmanship or both; this is the exclusive remedy. The purchaser is responsible for transportation cost of the equipment for warranty service or for any service call expense. Sellers liability is further expressly limited with respect to components manufactured by others, such as, but not limited to tubes, tires, bearings, detachable link and roller chains, or other trade accessories; to the extent of such warranties as are extended to sellers by these manufacturers. This warranty shall apply only within the boundaries of the continental United States.

Notice of defect shall be furnished in writing to the Seller and to the agent through whom the unit was purchased, disclosing in full all known defects and failure in operation and use. Reasonable time shall be given to the Seller to remedy any such defects and failures.

This warranty is in lieu of all other warranties, expressed (except as set forth within) or implied, including but not limited to warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose. Manufacturer makes no warranty as to the design, capability, capacity, nor suitability for use of the unit. The obligation and liability of sellers under this warranty does not extend to loss of crops, loss because of delay in harvesting or any expense or loss incurred for labor, supplies, substitute machinery or rental machinery, transportation, or other charges.

Except as provided herein, manufacturer shall have no liability or responsibility to purchaser or any other person or entity with respect to any liability, loss, or damage caused or alleged to be caused directly or indirectly by the unit including, but not limited to, any indirect, special, consequential, or incidental damages resulting from the use or operation of the unit or any breach of this warranty. Not withstanding the above limitations and warranties, manufacturer's liability hereunder for damages incurred by purchaser or others shall not exceed the price of the unit.

T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc., reserves the right to make changes in design and components or material or to utilize available materials which it deems satisfactory, in order to improve its products. Also, T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc. reserves the right to make changes in the construction or design of any parts without incurring any obligations to install these improvements or changes on previously delivered units.

This warranty shall be void if any part or parts not manufactured or supplied by T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc., are used either in servicing or maintaining the unit, and sellers obligation to repair or replace parts are then voided. This warranty shall be void if in the judgement of T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc., repairs are made in such a manner to affect this unit in a materially adverse manner or if this unit is operated unsafe or while in a state of disrepair. This warranty shall be void if equipment is used for commercial, industrial, lease, rental, custom operation and non-agricultural use. Any damage to this product as a result of misuse, abuse, neglect, accident, improper installation, alteration, repairs (not out own), improper adjustment, accident, damage by fire, act of God, lack of performing required maintenance or any other use contrary to our instructions will void the warranty. This warranty will be void if the product serial numbers are altered, defaced or removed.

If any provision of this limited warranty shall violate any applicable law and is held to be unenforceable, then the invalidity of such provision shall not invalidate any other provisions herein. Applicable law may provide rights and benefits to purchaser in addition to those provided herein.

The terms and conditions of this warranty cannot be altered, modified, or waived by any seller without the expressed, written consent of an officer of T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc.

Notice

T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc., disclaims any liability for the operation of the equipment with the safety shields removed or modified. The nature of this product require that it be operated in a safe way only, and in good repair by qualified persons. Each purchaser, through the process of purchasing this equipment, agrees with T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc., to operate it in a safe manner and in accordance with applicable state and federal laws and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless sellers, from any loss to any person or persons caused by purchaser's failure to do so. Each purchaser further agrees to bring to the attention this notice to each subsequent purchaser, and to obtain his agreement thereto as a condition of resale or transfer.

To make this warranty effective, the Owners "Warranty Registration" card (located inside Owners/Operator's Manual) must be filled out and sent to T.R. Metal Crafters, Inc. within 30-days of purchase.




