PEANUT BOX SQUIRREL FEEDER



Squirrels live in various forests, especially those with nut trees, and prefer hardwoods and mixed woods. The squirrel is a year-round resident seen mostly in the morning and evening in the yard. Most squirrels feed primarily on hickory nuts, acorns, beech nuts, and walnuts. They also favor fruit, maple seeds, tulip tree seeds, and corn.

Setting up this squirrel peanut box on your property gives these animals a reliable food source, especially during colder months when food may be more scarce and less readily available. This box lets squirrels lift the lid to help themselves to the food within. An extended platform lets these animals rest and feed comfortably.

A squirrel feeder placed on your property may help divert the attention of these rodents away from any bird feeders or flower beds, reducing the negative impact they could potentially cause to your outdoor gardening efforts.

MOUNTING YOUR SQUIRREL FEEDER

- 1. On the back of the feeder is a pre-drilled hole at both the top and bottom of the panel. Place a nail through the pre-drilled hole at the top to secure the feeder to a tree or post.
- **2.** Put another nail or screw through the hole at the bottom of the back panel and into the tree or post to provide extra support to the feeder.
- **3.** Fill the box with peanuts in the shell, peanut chunks, corn, or large seeds to attract squirrels.
