



Possibly one of the most popular of all commercially cultivated flower bulb plants, this genus has different height variations. Flower size, shape, and even coloring. Snowdrops are narrow-leafed, with delicate milk-white and green tipped hanging flowers. This flower is popular in North America, the British Isles, and northern France. They make for an excellent deciduous woodland plant and is also commonly known as the "flower of hope."

About This Variety: Galanthus nivalis are lovely, single blossoms that push out of the ground often before the snow has gone. Critter resistant and a good naturalizer.

Growing Instructions: To prevent the bulbs from drying out, buy them early in the season and plant them as soon as possible.

Care Tip: Planted in moist soil, they will multiply into drifts and provide plenty of plants to share with fellow gardeners. Do not let the soil dry out. Mulch lightly in winter.

Exposure: Full sun to partial shade *Height:* Grows 6" tall *Spacing:* Plant 2" apart, 4" deep *USDA Zones:* Hardy in USDA zones 3-9
