




REMOTE BATTERY INSTALLATION

- 1. Loosen and remove the lock screw located on the side of your remote control and remove the battery compartment lid
- Insert 2 AA batteries according to the polarity information located in the compartment; make sure the (+) and (-)
 poles of each battery are positioned correctly, (Figure 1).
- 3. Replace the battery compartment door and screw; tighten screw completely to lock in place.

VEHICLE BATTERY CHARGING

Your Timber Rover is powered by a rechargeable lithium battery. To charge the battery, please do the following:

- Loosen and take out the lock screw located on the bottom of your Timber Rover and remove the battery compartment lid.
- 2. Remove the rechargeable cell by pressing down on the release lever located on the female connector, (Figure 2).
- Attach the wired end of the lithium battery to the USB charging cable included with your Timber Rover by inserting the male end of the cell into the female connector; align the two pins of the connector with corresponding receptacles of the male end.
- 4. Plug the USB end into a PC or charging block. WARNING: Only use a charging block rated at 5.0 volts or lower.
- One side of your USB charging cable will illuminate in red while charging. When charging is complete, the light will turn off. Fully charge the battery before first use.
- 6. After charging, reinstall the lithium battery into the Timber Rover by inserting the male end of the cell into the female connector; align the two pins of the connector with corresponding receptacles of the male end (Figure 3). Replace the battery compartment door and screw; tighten screw completely to lock in place.

OPERATION

- Activate your Timber Rover by moving the red toggle switch located on the bottom of the vehicle to the ON
 position. To deactivate, move the switch to the OFF position.
- Use the trigger of the remote to control the direction your Timber Rover moves. Pulling the trigger back will move it forward; pushing the trigger forward will move it in reverse, (Figure 4).
- Your Timber Rover turns using the dial located on the top of your remote. To turn right, move the dial forward/ clockwise. To turn left, move the dial backward/counterclockwise, (Figure 4).



- Not suitable for children under 6 years of age.
- Installation of batteries should ALWAYS be done by an adult.
- · Keep fingers, hair and loose clothing away from the vehicle's tires and wheels.
- · Don't pick up the vehicle while in motion.
- Don't put your vehicle or remote control near any source of heat.
- · Don't operate your vehicle in dangerous places.
- Only use charging blocks rated at 5.0 volts or lower.
- $\bullet \quad$ Don't let the vehicle get wet. Don't run through water or operate in the rain.
- Do not disassemble the vehicle or remote control.
- · If the vehicle is damaged and any broken parts are exposed, the vehicle should not be used.
- Watch for and avoid obstacles.
- · Turn the vehicle off when not in use. Remove the remote control's batteries if not used for a prolonged period.

BATTERY CARE:

DISPOSABLE BATTERIES

- · Failure to insert batteries in the correct polarity may shorten the life of the batteries or cause batteries to leak.
- · Do not mix old and new batteries.
- · For best results, use alkaline batteries.
- Do not mix Alkaline, Standard (Carbon-Zinc) or Rechargeable (Nickel Cadmium) or (Nickel Metal Hydride) batteries.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire.
- Batteries should be recycled or disposed of as per manufacturer's recommendations.

RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES

- Fully charge your battery before using your product for the first time.
- · Use only the rechargeable lithium battery and USB-C cable provided with your product to charge.
- · Do not store your product in a high-temperature environment including heat caused by intense sunlight.
- Do not place product in fire or other excessively hot locations; exposure to fire or temperature above 212° may cause an explosion.
- Do not dispose of the battery in the garbage. Disposal of batteries in the garbage is unlawful under state and federal
 environmental laws.
- · Do not dispose of batteries in fire.
