



# 10 SPRAYER TIPS & TRICKS

If you've just purchased a new FIMCO sprayer, this guide will walk you through 10 simple steps to set it up right the first time. A few minutes of prep now can save you hours of frustration later. Let's get started.

## 1 **TIGHTEN HOSE CLAMPS**

Make sure to tighten all hose clamps to avoid leaks and pressure issues.



## 2 **INSPECT THE TANK**

Look inside the tank. Remove any parts or loose items that may be inside from the manufacturer.



## 3 **RINSE OUT TANK**

Rinse out the tank with clean water to remove any dust and debris left over from the manufacturing process.



## 4 **TEST WITH PLAIN WATER**

Before adding chemicals, make sure to test the system with water to ensure everything is working properly.



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## OPEN THE INTAKE VALVE

If your sprayer has a shut-off valve on the intake line, open it.

## CLOSE THE MANIFOLD VALVES

Close any valves on the manifold so the pump can build pressure properly when you start it up.

## POWER UP THE PUMP

Turn the pump on and let it build pressure. Once it reaches its rated PSI, it will automatically shut off. It will restart when it's needed.

## ADJUST THE PRESSURE

Set the pressure to your desired spraying level. For most applications, around 30 PSI is ideal.

## CHECK THE STRAINER

Shut off the pump, close the intake valve, and check the strainer. You want to see clean, clear water flowing to the pump with no debris.

## ADD CHEMICALS AND SPRAY

If everything checks out and the strainer is clear, you're ready to add chemicals and begin spraying.
