orchid environment

What should you know when bringing a orchid home into your home for the first time?

- Keep your orchid in a spot where it will receive some indirect light throughout the day, and away from direct sunlight
- Your orchid will be healthiest in a shady environment.
- The ideal temperature for your orchid to flourish is between 65F – 75F / 18C - 23C and keep away from direct drafts!
- Direct drafts, like those from air conditioning, will dry out your orchid and accelerate wilting.

orchid care

Lift the plant with the grow pot from it's decorative container.

- Check the roots and poke around the bark media!
 - Is your bark media damp or dry?
 - What color are the roots?
- Green-gray roots are okay, brown and stiff roots mean your orchid isn't receiving enough water.

Remember D.D.D

- **Drench** the roots until all the roots are covered in water. Leave the plant dunked in water for five minutes.
- **Drain** the plant for another five minutes. Water should not be dripping from the bottom, nor should it be sitting in an enclosed container.
- **Discard** residual water before returning the plant to the decorative container.

warning signs

While taking care of your orchid, you may start to notice these warning signs.



- The leaves have a slight yellow tint. Your flower is wilting early.
- The leaves start to wrinkle and become spongy.
- Yellow or brown roots.
- Red tint on the leaves.
- The texture of the leaf is thinning.
- Healthy greenish-grey roots start to turn mushy.
